As one of the most respected transportation professionals in the country, Tony has demonstrated his keen understanding of this complicated industry throughout his career. His experience at the federal and state government levels enables him to utilize his vast transportation knowledge to develop consensus amongst many diverse constituencies to create and implement transportation infrastructure programs and projects. His work includes:

- Served as the Chief Deputy Director for the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) where he managed multi-modal operations of the largest state transportation department in the country. He led the department through several transportation programming cycles and periods of both significant growth and reduction while continuing to improve project delivery.
- Served as Caltrans' District Director responsible for the state transportation system in Los Angeles and Ventura counties.
- While at Caltrans worked on projects such as the Interstate 5 widening and Route 91 Toll Road in Orange County and the Cypress Replacement Freeway in Oakland.
- Worked for the Federal Highway Administration in the area of transportation funding, design and environmental clearance.
- Facilitated the formation of a partnership (Caltrans and private sector) and managed a team with the objective to implement new HOV and truck lanes on I-5 in northern Los Angeles County. The environmental document was completed under budget and in nearly half the estimated time. Through a combination of public and private sources, the project (approx. \$ 500 million) is fully funded and the first phase is under construction.
- Worked with Caltrans, Orange County, Rancho Mission Viejo and a team of consultants to complete the environmental document and design for the widening of Ortega Highway. Implementation (environmental, design, construction) was funded through public and private sources and completed through a unique public – private partnership approach, which resulted in time and cost savings. The widening (approx. \$ 30 million) completed construction in late 2011.

Tony's unparalleled institutional knowledge and understanding of project delivery is a key to "Making P3 Projects Happen". He has a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from North Carolina State University and is also a founding partner of Point C Partners.
